## THE 100 LARGEST PUBLIC WATER SUPPLIES IN SOUTH CAROLINA—1995

#### **ABSTRACT**

Public water supplies in South Carolina used about 450 million gallons per day in 1994, 77 percent of it from surface-water sources and 23 percent from wells and springs. The five largest supplies were Greenville, Charleston, Columbia, Spartanburg, and Anderson. Sumter, ranking seventh in size, is the largest supply using only ground water. The range in pumping for the 100 largest supplies is 52 million gallons per day for the largest to 0.9 million gallons per day for the smallest.

#### INTRODUCTION

A report with this title was published in 1990 as South Carolina Water Resources Commission Report 169. In the ensuing 5 years there have been significant changes in the size and source of many of the public water supplies; therefore, an updating of the compilation seems warranted. This report will be issued by the Water Resources Commission's successor agency, the Water Resources Division of the newly constituted South Carolina Department of Natural Resources.

Water use by the 325 public supplies in South Carolina averaged about 450 million gallons per day in 1994. It was nearly 400 million gallons per day in 1989. Lakes and streams provided 77 percent of this water in 1994, wells and springs the rest.

Industrial water use is several times the public-supply use but is unlikely to be reliably estimated in the foreseeable future. Many industries obtain their water from public supplies, but many others are self supplied, owning their wells or other withdrawal facilities. Crop irrigation in South Carolina is a relatively small activity. Industrial and irrigation use are not closely monitored and are incompletely reported. Public-supply water use is closely monitored by the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC), and it is their Drinking Water Protection Division's Source Information Report that is the basis of the compilation presented here. David Curtis and Susan Alder of DHEC were very helpful by providing the computer printouts and other data that make this report possible.




Figure 1. Location of public water supplies using more than 5 million gallons per day in South Carolina.




Figure 2. Variability of per capita water use among South Carolina's 100 largest public water supplies.




Figure 3. 1994 withdrawals of water for public supplies in South Carolina.

To facilitate comparison with the previous report, the illustrations and listings here will be retained in form and position. Thus, the map (Fig. 1) shows the location of public supplies that use more than 5 million gallons per day. Figure 2 shows, by graph, the variability in the 1994 per capita use of water among the public supplies. As before, it should be said that a large part of the difference in per capita use among the public supplies is attributable to water purchased by industries from many of the public supply systems. An additional graph is provided in this report to illustrate the water withdrawals in the 46 counties of South Carolina (Fig. 3). The graph tells only where the water was withdrawn from the surface-water or ground-water sources, not where it was finally delivered and used. Many systems sell water to smaller systems in adjacent counties. In one example, water is delivered across the North Carolina line to the co-owner of a water treatment plant located in South Carolina.

## **EXPLANATION OF COMPILATION**

Most items in the compilation are self-explanatory, but a few may need clarification. "Population served" is the total population that obtains water from the system plus any smaller systems that purchase water from the named system. Thus, the population shown under a town name may appear much larger than the town's actual size. In connection with this, it is important to note whether a water system produces its own water supply or purchases it from another system. This will be obvious from the "source(s) of supply" entry.

The storage listed includes elevated (EL), ground (GR), and pressure tank (PT); storage is in millions of gallons.

Under "Treatment," several code letters identify the

types of treatment used. They are:

- B Disinfection by-products control
- C Corrosion control
- D Disinfection
- F Iron removal
- I Inorganics removal
- N No treatment at source
- P Particulate removal
- S Softening
- T Taste/odor control
- Z Fluoridation

The order of the various treatment steps is not indicated. Some treatments may take place more than once before the water is "finished."
