



Proposed Mining Process

- Installation of silt fence for sediment control
- Excavate in segments
- Ground clearing of vegetation as prepare each segment
- Remove and stockpile topsoil for future reclamation
- Excavate the segment to a maximum depth of 25'
- Load material onto trucks for transport offsite; no processing of material
- Grade side slopes as work progresses
- Inspect, repair and maintain graded banks

Proposed Dewatering Process


- Excavate a sump in each segment to collect and retain water
- Stormwater will be channeled into open cuts
- Groundwater and stormwater will be retained in the sump and allow time for solids to settle
- Clean water will be pumped from Segment 1 into a constructed outfall ditch with stone filter
 Water in Segments 2 and 3 will be pumped into Segment 1 for retention and discharge
- Water will be discharged from Segment 1
- All water accumulated must be discharged through the NPDES outlet and meet the standards for TSS and pH
- Clean water may be discharged into wetlands
- Flooding of downstream areas is prohibited
- Dewatering can not affect residential wells

Reclamation

Reclamation is the planned process for restoring the affected land to a useful purpose while protecting natural resources of the surrounding area.

- The proposed Reclamation Plan states the mine will be reclaimed to ponds and grasslands
- Side slopes will be graded as excavations progress
- Reclamation standards require ponds to have a minimum 4' depth over 50% of the surface area; banks must be sloped to a maximum 3H:1V grade to average water height
- Stockpiled topsoil will be spread on banks to promote growth of vegetation;
 - Permanent vegetation must be established
- Operator must inspect the work and conduct any necessary repairs and maintenance
- Financial assurance is required of all mines. The bond is in place to ensure reclamation is completed.

 General Permit for Non-Metal Mineral Mining
 - Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP)

 - Certification the mine is consistent with SC Coastal Zone
 Management Program

- Dewatering

Dewatering

- Dewatering is necessary to excavate the mine
- Stormwater and groundwater will be collected and discharged through a regulated outfall
- Dewatering cannot create flooding downstream of the mine
- Dewatering cannot impact residential wells

Dust

- Reduced disturbed area
- Water trucks
- Establishing Vegetative cover

Noise

- Equipment maintenance
- Buffers/Berms
- Noise standards for worker safety

Public Safety

- Controlled Access
- Gated Entry/Warning Signs
- Natural & Constructed Barriers
