Federal and state legislation provides liability protection to donors.

The **Bill Emerson Good Samaritan Food Donation Act** protects donors from civil and criminal liability should the product donated in good faith later cause harm to the recipient. South Carolina's legislation also protects good faith donors from criminal and civil liability.

Who can donate?

Restaurants, grocery stores and schools can donate. The S.C. Department of Environmental Services encourages donation as long as all food safety requirements are followed. Visit agriculture.sc.gov/divisions/consumer-protection/food-safety-compliance for more.

What to donate?

Non-Perishable Food
(e.g., canned food)

Perishable Food
(e.g., fresh produce, prepared food) can be donated.

Please reach out to your local food bank to learn what is accepted.

Where to donate?
