DID YOU KNOW?

Food waste is a serious problem across the county.

Where does food waste start?

It occurs at all levels of the system – from farm to plate – with nearly **72 percent** occurring at home and at food service businesses (e.g., restaurants, grocery stores).

In South Carolina, nearly
700,000 tons of food waste
were created in fiscal year
2023 while at the same time
1 in 8 South Carolinians
struggle with hunger
including 1 in 6 children.



Don't Waste Food SC (DWFSC)

DWFSC is a collaborative outreach campaign that brings together ambassadors from the public and private sectors dedicated to sharing knowledge, coordinating resources and working together to reduce food waste in South Carolina.



The goals of the campaign are to:

- Increase the awareness of the economic, environmental and social impacts of wasted food;
- Inspire individuals, communities, businesses, organizations, schools and others to take action to reduce food waste through prevention and donation; and
- Cut South Carolina's food waste in half by 2030.

The DWFSC campaign is centered on everyone doing their part to address this issue.

Each ambassador – from individual consumers to nonprofits, faith-based communities, grocery stores, restaurants, caterers, governments, farmers, schools, colleges/universities and more – has the opportunity to reduce food waste.

What are the benefits?

Reducing wasted food is your opportunity to lead by example and make a difference. By doing your part, you can help feed hungry people, save money and more.

As part of the campaign, the benefits include having:

- Your logo placed on the DWFSC website;
- Your success story placed on the DWFSC website and/or social media, shared on DWFSC YouTube videos, presentations and used in articles (all with your permission);
- Automatic entrance into the DWFSC annual recognition program;
- Customized signage, posters and other material provided to you; and

What is expected?

Each ambassador is required to:

Community Leaders Application

Community leaders are groups, businesses, schools, institutions, and organizations that have ample opportunity and resources to share our campaign.

Community leaders will be sources of information and useful materials to those around them. These groups provide a resource to their community, that may not know about food waste prevention and donation. Groups must attend trainings which will provide education and outreach materials.

Community leaders will have the chance to earn prizes for their group's efforts. All required survey questions must be completed before you can submit.

Individual Ambassador Application

To be an Ambassador, you must participate in and promote Don't Waste Food SC. Individuals are able to spread information and promote

the campaign by showing an example to others in their communities.

The goal for our individual ambassadors is to educate on the topics of food waste and best practices, so then you may go spread and promote the information to others. Individuals have existing connections that make it easier for them to communicate our message.

Most people would rather a friendly face tell them what to do instead of a government agency. Remember, anyone can make a difference when it comes to food waste.
