Annual State Public Water System Report – Calendar Year 2025

Each quarter, primacy agencies submit data to the Safe Drinking Water Information System (SDWIS/FED), an automated database maintained by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The data submitted include, but are not limited to, PWS inventory information, the incidence of Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL), Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level (MRDL), Monitoring/Reporting (M/R), Monitoring (M), Reporting (R) and treatment technique (TT) violations; and information on enforcement activity related to these violations. Section 1414(c)(3)(A)(i-ii) of the Safe Drinking Water Act requires states to provide EPA with an annual report of violations of the primary drinking water standards. The categories of violations are:

- a) Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) violation - Under the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA), the EPA sets national limits on contaminant levels in drinking water to ensure that the water is safe for human consumption. These limits are known as MCLs.
- b) Treatment Technique (TT) violation - For some regulations, the EPA establishes treatment techniques in lieu of an MCL to control unacceptable levels of certain contaminants. For example, treatment techniques have been established for viruses, bacteria, turbidity, and lead.
- c) Monitoring & Reporting (M/R) violation – If a PWS fails to have its water tested as required or fails to report test results correctly to the primacy agency, a monitoring violation occurs.
- d) Monitoring (M) or Reporting (R) violation – Microbials under the Revised Total Coliform Rule, beginning April 1, 2016, a PWS is required to monitor and verify that the levels of contaminants present in the water do not exceed the MCL or MRDL. If a PWS fails to have its water tested as required, a monitoring violation occurs. If a PWS fails to report test results correctly to the primacy agency, a reporting violation occurs.

Public Water System

A Public Water System (PWS) is defined as a system that provides water via piping or other constructed conveyances for human consumption to at least 15 service connections or serves an average of at least 25 people for at least 60 days each year. There are three types of PWSs. PWSs can be community systems (such as towns), non-transient non-community systems (such as schools or factories), or transient non-community systems (such as rest stops or parks).

There are two types of source water: groundwater and surface water. Ground water systems (GWS) are those systems depending on wells to provide their drinking water supply; while surface water systems (SWS) are those systems that depend on lakes, rivers, and streams for their drinking water supply. SWS, as defined by federal regulation, provided water to a population of 4,104,130 residents, or 86% of the total population. GWS, as defined by federal regulation, provided water to a population of 656,519 residents, or 14% of the total population.

Additional Information Regarding Violations

In 2025, there were 289 total violations. The violation categories include Maximum Contaminant Level Violations (MCL), Treatment Technique violation (TT), Monitoring and Reporting Violations (M/R), Monitoring Violations (M) and Reporting violations (R) . The violations for 2025 represented 205 federally defined PWSs* or 15% of the 1,386 federally defined PWSs, serving 965,359 or 20% of the total South Carolina population of 4,760,649.

*The table indicates the total number of PWSs with violations as 289, but some PWSs had more than one type/category of violation. The unique number of PWSs with violations (more than one, and/or more than one type) was 205 PWSs for 2025. The table above summarizes the violations in 2025.

‡ - # of Resolved Violations represents the number of violations that have been resolved (returned to compliance) during the calendar year. Due to EPA requirements to consider a system's violation resolved, it could take up to a year of monitoring data meet the standard to return to compliance.

Microbials

South Carolina's microbiological program monitors PWS for compliance with the Revised Total Coliform Rule (RTCR) and the Groundwater Rule (GWR). The RTCR establishes a MCL for *E. coli* and uses *E. coli* and total coliforms to initiate a 'find and fix' approach to address fecal contamination that could enter the distribution system (DS). It requires PWSs to perform assessments to identify sanitary defects and act to correct them. The RTCR applies to all PWSs and requires all federally defined PWSs to develop a self-monitoring program for their system. The GWR establishes a risk-targeted approach to identify GWSs susceptible to fecal contamination and requires corrective action to correct significant deficiencies and source water fecal contamination in all federally defined public GWSs. The GWR applies to all PWSs that use ground water, including consecutive systems. The GWR requires all federally defined systems that detect total coliform in their DS to collect a sample from each source in use at the time of the total coliform positive. South Carolina requires all CWS and NTNCWS develop a self-monitoring program utilizing a South Carolina certified lab for analyzing samples. South Carolina DES collects and analyzes microbiological samples quarterly, monthly, or annually for TNCWS.

The RTCR requires that when total coliforms are found present in a routine sample, *E. coli* must be analyzed to confirm its absence or presence in the sample. The presence of *E. coli* is a health-related contamination of drinking water and requires the PWS to notify its customers. This type of violation is shown in the report as MCL *E. coli* (RTCR).

South Carolina had six (6) MCL *E. coli* (RTCR) violations in six (6) PWSs (CWS-2, 1-NTNCWS, TNCWS-3) serving a population of 1,625 or <1% of the total population (4,760,649). The MCL *E. coli* (RTCR) violations represented 2% of the total violations (289) and <1% of the total number of PWSs (1,386) in South Carolina.

There were sixteen (16) M/R source water (GWR) violations in fifteen (15) PWSs (CWS-12, TNCWS-3) serving a population of 21,364 or <1% of the total population (4,760,649). Some PWSs incurred more than one violation in the calendar year. The M/R, Source Water (GWR) violations represented 6% of the total violations (289) and 1% of the total number of PWSs (1,386) in South Carolina. The GWR requires PWSs that detect total coliform in their distribution system to collect a sample from each groundwater source in use at the time of the total coliform positive. This M/R violation occurs when the PWS fails to sample/monitor (indicated "Major" - 11 violations) or fails to sample/monitor all groundwater sources active at the time of the total coliform positive sample event (indicated "Minor" - 5 violations).

There were thirty-one (31) Monitoring (M) violations in twenty-seven (27) PWSs (CWS-6, NTNCWS-2, TNCWS-19) serving a population of 39,065 or 1% of the total population (4,760,649). Some water systems incurred more than one violation in the calendar year. These M violations represented 11% of the total violations (289) and 2% of the total number of PWSs (1,386) in South Carolina.

If the routine or repeat samples were not collected, the violation was major. There were twenty (20) of the M violations were M, Routine, Major (RTCR) representing 18 PWS (CWS-4 NTNCWS-1, TNCWS-13) serving a population of 1,466 or <1% of the total population (4,760,649). The M, Routine, Major (RTCR) violations represented 1% of the total number of PWSs (1,386) and 7% of the total number of violations (289).

RTCR further requires that a PWS on a monitoring frequency less than monthly (e.g., quarterly, annually), must collect an additional three (3) routine samples the month following a total coliform positive (TC+) sample result. The violation, M, Additional Routine (RTCR), has both major and minor severity indicators. A major indicator means that none of the additional routine samples were collected the month following a TC+ sample result. A minor indicator means that some, but not all the additional routine samples were collected.

In 2025, there were nine (9) M violations for M, Additional Routine (RTCR) representing six (6) PWS (NTNCWS-1, TNCWS-5) serving a population of 412 or <1% of the total population (4,760,649) represented <1% of the total number of PWSs (1,386) and 3% of the total violations (289).

RTCR requires a PWSs to notify the State within 24-hours about an EC+ compliance sample result. During 2025, two (2) CWS failed to notify the State within the 24-hour requirement. These CWS served a population of 20,393, representing <1% of the total population served (4,760,649), <1% of the total number of PWSs (1,386), and <1% of the total violations (289). This violation has been indicated on the chart as R, Notification, E coli Positive (RTCR).

Chemicals

South Carolina DES collects and analyzes chemical samples utilizing a Standardized Monitoring Framework (SMF) which standardizes, simplifies, and consolidates monitoring requirements across contaminant groups. The SMF increases public protection by simplifying monitoring plans and synchronizing monitoring schedules leading to increased compliance with monitoring requirements. The SMF reduces the variability within monitoring requirements for chemical and radiological contaminants across systems sizes and types. The regulated contaminants include fifteen (15) Inorganic Contaminants (IOCs), fifty-one (51) Synthetic Organic Contaminants (SOCs) and Volatile

Organic Contaminants (VOCs), and four (4) Radionuclides. South Carolina's monitoring includes monitoring for all federally defined PWSs, including CWS, NTNCWS and TNCWS. All federally defined PWSs are monitored for Nitrate and Nitrite. All CWS are monitored for IOCs, SOCs, VOCs and Radionuclides. All NTNCWS are monitored for IOCs, SOCs and VOCs.

In 2025, one (1) CWS incurred two violations for failing to monitor for SOCs. These MR violations were incurred by one (1) PWSs (CWS-1, serving a population of 9,530) <1% of the total population (4,760,649).

These chemical violations (Total Polychlorinated Biphenyls (PCB) and Toxaphene) represents <1 % of the PWSs in South Carolina and <1% of the total violations (289). In 2024, 99% of South Carolina PWSs were without chemical violations, serving 99% of the total population. These violations have been indicated on the chart with a description of M, Regular

Disinfection and Disinfection Byproducts

South Carolina DES samples for disinfectants and disinfection byproducts in accordance with the Stage 1 Disinfectants and Disinfection Byproducts (S1D/DBP) Rule and Stage 2 Disinfectants and Disinfection Byproducts (S2D/DBP) Rule. The addition of a chemical disinfectant requires a PWS to monitor Total Trihalomethanes (TTHMs) and Haloacetic Acids (HAA5). Upon implementation of S2D/DBP Rule, monitoring was required for all CWS and NTNCWS that use primary or residual disinfectant or deliver (sell) treated water. These rules also required water systems to submit an initial distribution system evaluation (IDSE) to identify sites for D/DBP sampling.

There were six (6) MCL Violations MCL, Average (TTHM) incurred by (5) PWSs (CWS-5) serving a population of 26,755 or <1% of the total population (4,760,649). Some PWSs incurred more than one violation in the calendar year. These violations represented 2% of the total violations (289) and <1% of all PWSs (1,386). During 2025 no PWS incurred a violation for MCL, Average (HAA).

In rare instances, DES staff and regional staff may fail to identify or collect required samples for a water system. In 2025, two (2) sampling events were recorded as missed, resulting in three (3) violations for 2 PWS (CWS-2) serving a population of 52,508 which represents 1% of the total population (4,760,649), <1% of the total PWSs (1,386) and 1% of the total violations (289). These M/R violations will return to compliance in 2026. These violations are recorded as M/R Stage 2 (DBP) on the violation chart.

Five (5) MR violations (CWS-5) for failure to monitor and report disinfectant residual or to maintain certification with the State to analyze residuals occurred in 2025. The total population served by these systems was 43,083 representing <1% of the total population (4,760,649), <1% of the total PWSs (1,386), and 2% of the total violations (289). These violations are recorded as M/R Residual (DBP) on the violation chart.

Surface Water Treatment

The Surface Water Treatment Rule (SWTR), Interim Enhanced Surface Water Treatment Rule (IESWTR), Filter Backwash Recycling Rule (FBRR), Long Term 1 Enhanced Surface Water Treatment Rule (LT1ESWTR), and Long Term 2 Enhanced Surface Water Treatment Rule (LT2ESWTR) apply to surface

water systems and groundwater systems under the influence of surface water. These rules improve public health protection through the control of microbial contaminants, particularly viruses, *Giardia lamblia*, and *Cryptosporidium*. South Carolina DES requires the PWSs to which these rules apply to self-monitor and report to DES through monthly operating reports.

Under SWTR there were two (2) violations for two (2) CWS serving 36,987. The violation was for failure to collect and report distribution system disinfectant concentrations. These violations represented <1% of the public water systems (1,386), 1% of the total population (4,760,649), and 2% of the total violations (289). These violations are noted on the chart as Monitoring of Treatment (SWTR).

Lead and Copper

The Lead and Copper Rule (LCR) establishes an Action Level (AL) of 0.015 mg/L for Lead (Pb) and 1.3 mg/L for Copper (Cu) based on 90th percentile levels of tap water samples. An AL exceedance is not a violation but triggers other requirements that may include water quality parameter (WQP) monitoring, corrosion control treatment (CCT), source water monitoring/treatment, public education, or lead service line replacement (LSLR). The LCR applies to all CWS and NTNCWS.

Reported in Calendar Year 2025 are seventy (70) M/R violations under LCR. These violations will be presented in two types, one type will be designated M/R LCR Tap which is the failure of the PWS to either (a) collect all or some of the required initial tap samples or (b) collect all or some of the required follow-up/routine tap samples. The other will be designated M/R Lead Consumer Notice which is the failure of the PWS to provide notice of lead results to individuals served by taps used for LCR tap monitoring, in accordance with the timing, content and delivery requirements or failure to submit a sample notice and certification to the State. Monitoring and reporting violations do not represent health-based violations.

There were (58) fifty-eight M/R LCR Tap violations which occurred in fifty-two (52) PWSs (CWS-46, NTNCWS-8) serving a population of 180,269 which represents 4% of the total population (4,760,649) 4% of the total PWSs (1,386) and 20% of the total violations (289). Six (6) PWSs incurred more than one violation.

There were twelve (12) M/R Lead Consumer Notice violations which occurred in eleven (11) PWSs (CWS-11) serving a population of 21,309 which represents <1% of the total population (4,760,649), 1% of the total PWSs (1,386), and 4% of the total violations (289).

Lead and Copper Rule Revisions (LCRR)

The Lead and Copper Rule established national action limits for lead and copper in drinking water. The rule was modified by the LCRR on October 16, 2024. Rule modifications required the submission of an initial inventory of service line materials, where the material of every service line served by a public water system subject to the rule was classified as lead, galvanized requiring replacement, lead status unknown, or non-lead. If no inventory was completed, a treatment technique violation was assessed under the LCRR. The failure to submit the inventory to the state is a reporting violation under the LCRR.

Violations were reported in two categories Treatment Technique (TT) violations Initial Service Line Inventory and Reporting violations Initial Service Line Inventory (LSLI) Reported late. Systems that did not complete their initial service line inventory as required under the LCRR received a Treatment Technique violation These water systems also received a second violation for failing to report their Initial Service Line Inventory to the state.

There were thirty (30) R LSLI Reported late which occurred in thirty (30) PWSs (CWS-22, NTNCWS-8) serving a population of 61,975 which represents 1% of the total population (4,760,649), 2% of the total PWSs (1386), and 10% of the total violations (289).

There were thirty (30) TT LSLI Not Developed which occurred in thirty (30) PWSs (CWS-22, NTNCWS-8) serving a population of 61,975 which represents 1% of the total population (4,760,649), 2% of the total PWSs (1386), and 10% of the total violations (289).

There were thirty (23) Notification, Known or Potential LSL which occurred in thirty (23) PWSs (CWS-22, NTNCWS-1) serving a population of 152,534 which represents 3% of the total population (4,760,649), 2% of the total PWSs (1386), and 8% of the total violations (289).

The LCRR also requires water systems with an exceedance of the lead action level to provide public notification to its customers within 24 hours after being made aware of the exceedance. Failure to correctly complete this public notification results in the PN Lead Action Level Exceedance. In 2025 one system did not correctly provide public notification to their customers and/or provide a certified copy of the notification to the state as required under the LCRR. The total population served by this CWS was 98 representing <1% of the total population (4,760,649), <1% of the total PWSs (1,386), and <1% of the total violations (289).

Public Notice

The Public Notice (PN) Rule requires all public water systems (PWSs) to notify their consumers any time a PWS violates a National Primary Drinking Water Regulation or has a situation posing a risk to public health. This rule applies to all PWSs. In 2025, there was one (1) violation, PN Violation for NPDWR Violation, in (1) PWS (NTNCWS-1). The total population served for this PWSs was 25 representing <1% of the total population (4,760,649), <1% of the total PWSs (1,386), and <1% of the total violations (289).

Consumer Confidence Rule

The Consumer Confidence Reports Rule (CCR) established minimum requirements for the content of annual reports that community water systems (CWS) delivered to their customers. The reports contained information on the quality of the water delivered by the PWSs and characterized the risks (if any) from exposure to contaminants detected in the drinking water in an accurate and understandable manner. The Regulation applied only to CWS. In 2025, there were nine(9) violations, M/R Failure to deliver CCR Report, in eight (8) PWS (CWS-8). The total population served for these PWSs was 16,317 representing <1% of the total population (4,760,649), 1% of the total PWSs (1,386), and 3% of the total violations (289).

In addition, the CCR established that no later than the date the system was required to distribute the report to its customers, each CWS was required to mail a copy of the report to the Department, followed within three (3) months by a Certification that the report had been distributed to customers, that the information was correct and consistent with compliance monitoring data either provided by or submitted to the Department. . In 2025, there were thirty-eight (38) violations, M/R Failure to submit CCR Certification, in thirty-eight (38) PWS (CWS-38). The total population served for these PWSs was 473,065 representing 10% of the total population (4,760,649), 3% of the total PWSs (1,386), and 14% of the total violations (289).

Enforcement

The Drinking Water Enforcement Section functions to carry out enforcement actions involving all aspects of public water system compliance. The functions of the Enforcement section, combined with the efforts of the Drinking Water Compliance Monitoring Section, the Drinking Water Protection Division, the Bureau of Water, the Bureau of Environmental Health Services Regional Offices, and other areas within DES, work together to ensure safe drinking water for the continued health and welfare of the citizens of South Carolina. The goal is to bring PWSs back into compliance and protect the health of the public.

Variances and Exemptions

Variances and exemptions to specific requirements of the Safe Drinking Water Act Amendments of 1996 may be granted under certain circumstances. If a PWS meets the specific criteria outlined in the *State Primary Drinking Water Regulation*, R.61-58, DES may approve such a variance or exemption. South Carolina has three (3) non-community public water systems subject to a variance for Nitrate.

Additional Monitoring – Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS)

Protecting public health and ensuring the safety of South Carolina’s air, land, and water has continued to remain one of DES’s highest priorities. One of the challenges with this priority has been addressing chemicals for which the agency has no regulatory authority. These chemicals, referred to as emerging contaminants, are those with which we have a new awareness and understanding of how they behave in the environment and affect public health.

One class of these emerging contaminants is per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS), a group now believed to be more than 9,000 man-made chemicals that have been used since the 1940s for their heat resistance and water-, oil-, and dirt-repellence. Because of their stability, PFAS resist breakdown by natural processes and persist in the environment indefinitely, earning them the nickname “forever chemicals.” The most common exposure route is from swallowing food or water that contains PFAS.

Conclusions

In summary, South Carolina’s PWSs and South Carolina DES continue to work cooperatively to provide quality drinking water for South Carolinians. Of the State’s 1,386 PWSs, 1,181 PWSs, or approximately 85% were in full compliance with all regulatory requirements (health-based, monitoring and reporting, other) during Calendar Year 2025, serving a population of 3,795,290 or 79% of the total population.

Monitoring and Reporting violations and ‘Other’ violations (Public Notice, CCR Certification) are not health-based violations. Excluding these violations (monitoring, reporting, other), South Carolina had 1,335 systems, 96% of all PWSs, that served a population of 4,669,727 or 98% of the total population that met all health-based standards. South Carolina DES is committed to improving the quality of life for all South Carolinians by protecting and promoting the health of the public and the environment.

Report Distribution and Availability

This report provides the consumers in the State of South Carolina information useful in assessing the quality of their drinking water and the success of South Carolina DES’s compliance and enforcement

activities. By disseminating this information, consumers will become more aware of their individual water providers and water quality. Consumers should feel free to ask questions of their PWS or of South Carolina DES. In addition, community water systems produce an annual Consumer Confidence Report, which provides detailed information about chemical sampling results and drinking water violations.
